BEHAVIOUR POLICY - RETURNING TO SCHOOL, JUNE 2020 (COVID 19)

READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE

Expectations of parents/Carers

- NO Parents/Carers to enter school site
- Parents/Carers to handover children to member of staff on Parklands.
- Once children have been dropped off parents/carers are to leave the area.
- Any younger siblings must stay with their parents/carers.
- Ensure social distancing from other adults whilst waiting for staff on Parklands as per government guidance (please do not arrive too early to avoid conjection)
- Collect your child As Soon As Possible (ASAP) if called regarding illness/symptoms
- Stick to allocated drop off/pick up times if allotted time missed, please contact the office and arrange for a member of staff to meet you at the gate at 9:15am.
- Parents/Carers to collect child if purposefully not adhering to NO TOUCHING rules (reminders givenprior to this)

Expectations of children

- Normal behaviour rules/rewards/sanctions apply
- Children should stay at a social distance as much as possible (adults in school to remind children when necessary)
- Children should not play games that include touching others (e.g. tag, stuck in the mud etc...)
- Children not sticking to the NO TOUCHING rules will be reminded and parents informed to support with reinforcement
- Children to line up at a social distance in school when asked
- Children to enter the building separately and patiently
- Children to wash hands/sanitise when entering the building and at regular intervals throughout the day
- Any coughing/spitting on another pupil will result in being sent home
- Only use your own water bottle and equipment
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose and eyes and follow the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' advice

Rewards available:

- Verbal praise
- Dojo points
- Praise shared to parents/carers

Behaviour sanctions protocol:

Verbal reminder – A reminder about behaviour choice.

1st offence – name on the class board as a warning

2nd offence — X next to the name (final warning)

3rd offence — 5 minutes lost from break or lunch

4th offence - lunchtime detention issued (30 mins)

If a child is purposefully breaking the social distance rule or touching someone else's belongings staff should report to SLT and parents/carers will be called. Child will be allowed back in once all parties are happy that this will not happen again.
