Children experiment with figure drawing using different media in sketch books.
Use artist mannequin to support children.

Teach shading techniques using different media and allow children to explore in sketch books. Teach adding texture using different lines and give time to explore. Refer back to drawings of Claude Duval. Final piece is the children drawing Claude Duval using techniques learned to add tone and texture.Allow children to select paper and media they would like to use.





Children use sketch books to sketch elements of wallpaper designs focusing on line and texture.
Children design a 3D clay tile inspired by Morris's wallpaper designs. Plan design and evaluate and improve.

Children use clay to make their tile using slip, score, blend to attach clay pieces to tile.
